## WHY DO WE NEED TO RAISE AWARENESS OF HEAD AND NECK CANCER?

Head and neck cancer is the...

**6<sup>th</sup>** most common type of cancer  
in Europe.<sup>1</sup>

**8<sup>th</sup>** most common cause of cancer  
death in Europe.<sup>2</sup>

But it is a **preventable disease**, and  
**earlier presentation**, diagnosis and  
referral could **improve the chances  
of survival**.<sup>3</sup>

Approximately **60%** of all  
head and neck cancers are  
diagnosed at the advanced  
stage...<sup>4</sup>

...of these **66%** will not be  
alive after 5 years...<sup>5</sup>

...yet if diagnosed and treated  
in the early stages,  
**80-90%** will survive.<sup>6</sup>

2022 marks the **10<sup>th</sup> Make  
Sense campaign annual  
Awareness Week**—the

for patients with the disease.

Over the past 10 years,  
awareness of head and neck  
cancer has improved:

- A 2009 survey found 77%  
of people had not heard of  
the disease<sup>7</sup>
- A 2020 survey found 38%  
of people had not heard of  
the disease<sup>8</sup>

# IT'S NEVER BEEN MORE VITAL TO KNOW THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

## By 2030...

- Rates of head and neck cancer will increase by more than 200,000 worldwide<sup>9</sup>
- A further 587,000 people will die from head and neck cancer<sup>10</sup>

## Increasing awareness of head and neck cancer could...

- Save thousands of lives each year
- Reduce the devastating impact of the disease on survivors

Since 2013, the *Make Sense* campaign has promoted the life-saving 1for3 rule; if someone has any **ONE** of the following symptoms for **THREE** weeks, they should seek medical advice:



Sore tongue, non-healing mouth ulcers and/or red or white patches in the mouth



Blocked nose on one side and/or bloody discharge from the nose



Persistent hoarseness



Painful and/or difficulty swallowing



Lump in the neck



Pain in the throat
